## Layout Meets & Tours

**February:** we will visit the "Gopher Canyon Line", the outdoor railroad of Steve Sidensticker in San Diego. Just because this layout is outside don't dismiss it as being a toy train set running in the grass. This is a "scale" model railroad with precise trackwork, detailed rolling stock, and locomotives even the rivet counters will appreciate. Steve has regular operating sessions, which is unique for a railroad of this type (they also give you some appreciation for the jobs of real railroaders - following a "G" scale train can give you a workout). Some new trackwork has just been installed, and seeing the freight trains run without hesitation through long turnouts is pretty neat. Bring your hat!

**March:** I'm looking for either a tour volunteer, or a good road trip for March.

**April:** this will be the first viewing of a railroad we have not seen before. John Constans lives in Cardiff and is modeling the Westside Lumber Co. in Sn3. The railroad is in the development stage but a Shay or a Climax will be hauling a load of logs from the camp to the mill. John is hand laying all his track and uses PFM units to let you hear the geared locomotives strain up the grades. Projects under construction will let you see the railroad before it is complete and enjoy John's craftsmanship.

I would like to fill out the balance of the year before the convention in September with layouts we have not visited before, so if you are ready to take the "Tour Challenge" let me know and you can be on the schedule.

Layout tours start at noon, so for you early birds please don't show up at

breakfast time (you know who you are) because the host will be drinking coffee and cleaning track and trying to find that short in his wiring!

## A Special Invitation

From Steve Harris, Burton Maxwell, Dick Roberts & Joel Shank

Please join us the weekend of March 24-26 for the first San Diego and Imperial Counties Narrow Gauge Mini Meet to mingle with other Narrow Gaugers and to see and operate our layouts.

Open layouts will include:

- Joel Shank's Sn3 RGS. Built in it's own dedicated 33'X32' building, Joel's finished layout is considered to be one of the best RGS layouts in the country. Dozens of beautifully weathered scratch-built structures, fantastic scenery, and PFM sound. It was featured in a cover article in the October 2001 RMC.

- Dick Roberts Nevada County Narrow Gauge (using HO standard gauge equipment). Dick is building a true mushroom design layout with an automatic elevator. The layout is 21'X24'. Dick wrote an article on his layout and it's elevator for the January 2001 issue of Model Railroad Planning and has also published several RMC articles on sound chips he uses on his layout. Dick and his crew operate his layout using RailOp dispatching software. The layout is equipped with Digitrax DCC and Soundtraxx. The layout is about 80% complete. A Friday night operating session is planned.

- Pastor Burton Maxwell's H0n3 West Side Lumber Co. Hundreds of trees, beautiful scenery, scratch built locos, logging trucks and structures; and an operating overhead (literally) cable tram and other animated logging operations. The layout is 17'X37' and is about 90% complete. Burton's layout is not yet well known, but a must-see.

- Steve Harris' Hon3 RGS.

A two level layout with a helix and a semi-mushroom peninsula built in an office trailer. The upper level is 95% complete with mostly scratch- built structures. The layout is equipped with Easy DCC Soundtraxx and CT sound decoders. Steve's layout was featured on the cover of the November 2004 MR. He has also written several articles for the Gazette, including the Jan/Feb issue of this year.

In addition, we have made arrangements with the San Diego Model Railroad Club for attendees to operate the narrow gauge branch of their line. The SDMRC is one of the several layouts in the

## Membership

As you should know by now, the NMRA has changed the rules and rates for membership. Here is a short summary of how these changes affect us.

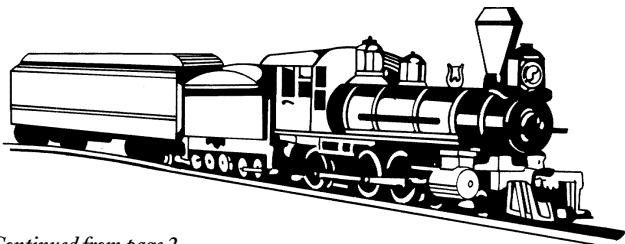
The NMRA no longer issues Life memberships. Those who have them will continue to hold them, but no new Life memberships will be issued.

The Regular NMRA membership rate for one year remains as it was, \$45. The Regular membership includes a subscription to Scale Rails, the national publication. The NMRA Affiliate membership, which does not include publications (Scale Rails, etc.), is now \$33, up from \$23, and the national subscription fee (to receive Scale Rails) is \$12, giving the \$45 total fee.

The PSR MEMBERSHIP, which was formerly \$7 per year, is now included in that rate. However, under the new rules, the PSR and other regions may charge a SUBSCRIPTION FEE for those members who wish to receive Region publications. This fee will cover the cost of preparation and distribution of the various Region newsletters and other announcements. This fee is currently \$8 per year for the PSR to receive the "PSR Dispatch".

These new rates went into effect December 1, 2005. A revised membership application form is included in this issue of The Mailhook. Please contact me if you have specific questions about your membership.

## Awards

Things have been very busy in the Golden Spike and AP Certificate awards area. In May I assisted Frank Tepedino make up a booklet with photographs for submitting an application for his first merit award on his HO "PRR Commissary Car, #492108". The award is a step toward the Master Builder - Cars AP certificate. The booklet contained a revised filling in of the Judge's Score Sheet, under Construction, Detail, Conformity, Finish and Lettering, and Scratchbuilding. If you are interested in learning how to fill in the "Judge's Score Sheet for NMRA Model Contests, you can refer to Duane Buck's "Contest Corner" article in the 2nd Quarter issue of the "PSR Dispatch". Within a few weeks of submitting his application, Frank received his Merit Award.

On August 20th, 2005 the monthly layout tour was held at Don Ham's "Casmalia Junction" layout, the first time this layout has been on the tour. It was a surprise to me to see a layout ready for the Golden Spike award on our first visit. I took the required photographs, filled in the application, and mailed it, along with a copy of Don's NMRA membership card. He received the award a few weeks later.

In October I got a nice surprise when Dick Roberts (whose layout has been visited a number of times by the Division) called me to start the awards process. I submitted his application for the Golden Spike Award, followed shortly by his applications for the Author, Master Builder Scenery, Model Railroad Engineer - Electrical and Model Railroad Engineer - Civil certificates. He should receive all of them this year at the PSR Convention in October.

Our Division is doing well in the Awards and Certificates qualifications, and we have four (4) Master Model Railroaders in the Division: Rodger Gredvig (218), Bob Schimmel (193), Paul Schmitt (342) and John Sigurdson (236). With the current activity, there should be a couple more within the next couple of years. But, there should be more! The AP and MMR programs are designed to take you into areas of the hobby that you may not have explored yet, with the goal of making you a better modeler. And you probably have already mastered a number of the skills necessary! So, think about getting busy and get involved in the program - San Diego should have more MMR's than any other part of the country - don't you think?
