We had a great time at the Fall Meet last November. We enjoyed the hospitality of the San Diego Model Railroad Museum (SDMRM), as well as good fellowship, good food, and a good Hobo auction. We started earlier this year to get a better chance at finding a parking space, and this seemed to work out well.

We opened with coffee and donuts, then got into the clinics. Duncan McRee gave us a presentation on Decoder Pro. This is a "shareware" product from JMRI (Java Model Railroad Interface). Decoder Pro allows users to change the configuration variables (or CVs) on DCC decoder-equipped locomotives. This is by far the easiest method of doing this. You can also manage operations on your railroad. JMRI has additional modules (Panel Pro, Logix) that may be useful as well.

Dick Roberts next regaled us on the construction of the Kidder Mansion on his Nevada County Railroad. The mansion was home to the superintendent of the Nevada County Narrow Gauge Railroad, and a signature structure on the prototype. Dick told us not only how he built the model, but how he researched the original building and designed it to fit the space (only part of the mansion is modeled), as well as how he created some of the outstanding details on the model.

We broke for lunch, and everyone must have enjoyed the pizza, since there was hardly any left. Thanks to Dave Balser for setting that up.

About 20 years ago I tried N scale. It turned out to be too small for me! Every time I got near an HO layout I knocked something off the rails! Then I visited Max Schwanda's O scale layout and I was hooked. I became a regular member of Max's Friday night operating crew.

Originally from Niagara Falls, NY, I lived about 100 yards from the New York Central line between Niagara Falls and Suspension Bridge. The Lehigh Valley had trackage rights on the NYC from Niagara Junction to Suspension Bridge. The Erie yard was three blocks to the East. The C&O laid over in the Erie yard and Canadian National inter-changed cars with NYC, LV and Erie. The CN still had steam engines. The LV had the contract to supply coal to CN. When my Uncle Bob first became a fireman he sometimes worked as a hostler and had to fill the tenders. So he had to learn how to run and fire steamers and diesels. My grandfather was a conductor on the LV and worked the "Buffalo Pick Up" 5 or 6 days a week. Every time the Pick Up went by the engineer would give a little toot and everyone would run out and wave. When the caboose went by Grand Pa would toot the little air whistle on the caboose. Eventually my uncle became the youngest engineer on the "Lehigh" and sometime it was a family affair. Also, the electric railway Niagara Junction interchanged with the LV and NYC and switched a lot of the plants on Eastern and South sides of town.

I now live in the Paradise Hill area of San Diego. My other interests include my family, and shooting. I model the Lehigh Valley, naturally. I have bench work and track laid down. I have gotten into kits in a big way, lately. I recently completed my first styrene kit (covered hopper) and am finishing up my first "wooden" kit. It is an old Westbrook flat car. It became a wooden kit because I didn't like the paper deck that came with the kit so I cut planks and decked it with individual boards.

I enjoy being a member of the NMRA, meeting other model railroaders, and seeing their layouts.

I have been involved with trains since 1950 when I received my S Gauge American Flyer Set which included a smoking 312AC Pacific with lit passenger cars and a mail car which actually picked up the mail bag on the fly. I was hooked. Every year I built up my railroad empire at my family home in New Jersey until my teenage years. After a stint in the USAF, I moved to San Diego with my family. In the 80's my son and I tried HO but there was no magic. It wasn't until my folks sent me two large boxes of my childhood trains in 2000 did the magic appear again. The grandkids were thrilled, grandpa had trains! To accommodate them, I built an 8 X 10 layout on two connected levels allowing for the operation of 4 trains at a time, each one controlled by a drawer containing an 8b transformer, switch controllers and accessory buttons. The lower level displays operating accessories from the 50's, located at the front of the layout for ease of operation, and the upper level depicts a small town along RT 66 in the 50's. Building and then modifying structure kits by installing lighting and interior details is what I really enjoy. I was thrilled to have a photo of my layout featured on the cover of the June 2007 NASG Dispatch Magazine. In 2008 several of us got together and formed a club named San Diego S Gauge to promote 1/64th railroading and to have fun. 

LAYOUT TOURS

January

In January we visited the Central Coast (HO) railroad of Don Ham. Don's layout is DCC, and is about 60% sceniced. Taking up one bay of a two-car garage, the layout consists of two peninsulas against the wall, with access on both sides of each

with access on both sides of each peninsula, forming a rough U shape. Both sides of one leg, most of the base, and some of the other leg have basic scenery contours applied, with painted backdrops, rock castings, roads, trees, and other scenic features. Work on scenes, including buildings and roads, is on-going for the base, and one peninsula. The other peninsula is basically complete. Trains ran flawlessly during our visit. Industries represented on the Central Coast Railroad include citrus packing, oil production, and sugar beet processing. Don scratch-built his sugar beet loader from pictures and an article in an old railroad magazine. Scale sugar beets are represented by



anise seeds. A former Navy pilot, Don has included several painted airplanes on his backdrops, a nice touch. Don is currently pursuing his MMR, with several certificates already in hand. If you missed this layout, you missed a great one!

March

In March we will visit the San Diego S Gaugers in their new clubhouse in Suite 106 in the 2445 Truxton building, Liberty Station. In the early days of model railroading, S-scale was called "S-gauge," and they



decided to honor tradition in naming their club. In their first year, they grew membership and built a 9- by 17-foot twotrack S-MOD layout. SDSG's layout was first exhibited at the GTE in Del Mar in December 2008, where it was well received by the public and members of the model railroading community alike.

Scenically, the layout packs a lot into a small area. Corner modules have generous curves in the 44-inch radius range. On two of the corners, the two-track main burrows under the local mountain range providing scenic interest. A prospering cattle ranch graces the third corner, and an orange grove can be found on the fourth. Five 4-foot straight modules host a rail yard with sidings serving an icehouse and icing dock, passenger station, and freight station. Four

straight modules house a siding with operating trackside action accessories from the A.C. Gilbert era (1946 through 1960s). Two more feature a trestle over fish creek and girder bridges over the creek that flows out of twin lakes. Additional straight modules are under construction and are slated for completion in the summer of 2012.

April

April will take us on a visit to Jim O'Connell's Pinnacle Creek Mining & Timber Company HO scale railroad in Santee. The Pinnacle Creek Mining & Timber Co. is set in SE Alaska, up a fjord which is accessible by sea. It is a small subsidiary of a larger mining company. While most locos (a 3-truck Shay, a 3-truck Heisler and a 2-truck Climax) are fairly new, most of the rest of the layout shows signs of getting less attention. The date of the layout is October 1, 1931, the Great Depression is taking place, and small mining sites like the PCM&T have, for the most part, to rely on themselves and not the parent company.

The layout is built on open L-girder benchwork that has already housed Z and N Scale layouts. This is my first HO endeavor. The PCM&T is an operations type of layout in that the locos do not go round and round. It is always back and forth and there are only two sidings for operations. Basically, the layout is very much scenery based, that is Jim's specialty, but moving different combinations of ore cars gives plenty of operating fun for him.

The layout is three levels with a 6.7 degree grade to be negotiated. Rockwork is fairly unique in that he used stucco, then carved the 'rock' before it dried. There are two mines; a wharf, upon which sits an engine house; and an ore tipple. These are all scratch-built. There is a mining camp with mostly scratch-built buildings. There are approximately 175 caspia trees, also made by Jim. The PCM&T is not a large road, but we think you will enjoy the quality of the work and appreciate what can be done in a bedroom-sized layout.

Jim's primary interest is scenery. He's only been modeling since 2005 and has had layouts published in five railroad magazines. Continental Modeler has photos of his N Scale layout in their hands. He has built layouts in Z Scale and these layouts reside in Germany, Mexico City, Japan, Singapore, Iowa, two in Virginia, Florida, and Oregon. So come to Santee and see the PCM&T. Some of you may know his old N layout, the Cascade Mining & Timber Co. It was in a layout tour February, 2010.

If you have small locos of your own, bring them to run or photograph if you want. The layout is DCC.
