Director's Report

As you no doubt know by now from the report in the Dispatch, the results of the survey regarding the status of nonmembers as convention registrants was overwhelmingly favorable, meaning +90% wanted to provide some way to accommodate them. It was suggested that attendance at a convention as a "visitor" would encourage participants to eventually want to officially join our ranks. With that in mind, the Regional BOD in March decided to adopt a policy that would add a \$10-20 surcharge (in addition to the normal registration fee) for nonmembers, but at the discretion of each Division or host, preferably the cost of an affiliate membership (currently \$17/yr). Coincidentally, the National BOD just adopted a similar policy with some limitation. They now offer for National Conventions, a \$9.95 six month membership, but it can only be used once; thereafter, full membership is required.

So, here are the possible arrangements for non-members that are now acceptable.

- 1. The host for a PSR convention can add a \$10-20 surcharge to the registration fee for non-members, but as a "non-member" they would not be entitled to vote at any PSR meeting, nor enter contests for judging or prizes. However, they would be able to attend clinics, tours, etc.
- 2. Or, charge a figure equal to the current Affiliate membership (currently \$17/yr) which entitles the

"member" to all the privileges of a member for a year because he is a member. (the only difference between a \$37 membership and a \$17 one is a subscription to the *Scale* Rails/Bulletin magazine).

3. Or, charge \$9.95 for the one-time membership



First, as you read this we have attended four mini-meets so far this year, and I want to thank Don Fowler, Art and Lou Dominy, Nelson Rath, plus Bob Chapparo and his friends, Mike Kressen, Bill Flynn, and Jim Lancaster of the Cajon Division in Orange County for letting us visit their homes and see the railroads they have built. In another section of the "Mail Hook" the balance of the mini-meets are listed for 2004. Please make an effort to visit these folks and see what they have accomplished. They enjoy showing off their efforts as much as you do visiting. I believe the essence of Model Railroading is layout construction, and as the new message at the top of Model Railroader magazine states, "Dream it. Plan it. Build it."

2005 will be an interesting year for minimeets. As tour director for the past two years I



find myself calling the same people over and over. My welcome is wearing a little thin with some. Here is the challenge! Pick out a month in 2005, and call me and tell me you will be one of the NEW layouts on the schedule! You will be amazed how motivated you become knowing you are COMMITTED to have visitors. Your layout does not have to be 100% complete, most are not. Visitors like to see benchwork, wiring, trackwork, and scenery under construction and maybe you will pick up some tips from others. The May 22nd Mini-Meet will be hosted by two members, Rodger Gredvig, MMR and Randy

Schissler, both in the Linda Vista area. Rodger is the builder of the "Lode Stone & Iron Railroad", a 12' x 12' garage layout depicting an imaginary bridge route between the Santa Fe and the




D&RGW from Grand Junction to the lower

Colorado River basin. It features desert to mountain scenery with lots of bridges (34 - count them!) The layout has been seen in over a dozen issues of "N Scale Magazine" and "Model Railroader". Rodger likes to tinker with animation, and has included an operating "horsehead" oil pump, only 3/4" high, moving mine skip, operating saw mill, and rotating windmill, along with some signal, lighting and sound effects. The layout is fully scenicked.

Randy Schisslers "Santa Fe and Arizona Northern", in HO scale, is one of the best small model railroads I have ever seen. This is an exceptional layout with many interesting features. Situated in a corner of

the living room of a condo, it has a full backdrop and appears much larger. Randy has incorporated





several mini scenes. Your attention is drawn to animated action, little vignettes, and subtle weathering that makes the scenes come to life. All of it is accentuated with the powerful sound of diesel hum and throb. Randy constructed one of Soundtraxx sound units, the SDX-1, and it fills the room and draws you into the action. It is a must see and hear layout.

The June 12th Mini-Meet will be a "ROAD TRIP" up north as the Cajon Division invites us to join them on their layout tour (details on page 7). Featured layouts will be Tom Frank's newly constructed On3 Rio Grande, Roger Clarkson's massive outdoor garden railroad and spectacular indoor HO scale railroad, and Bob Russel will have his award winning N scale "Orange Belt Lines" on display. Bob Chapparo, tour organizer, has 7 layouts lined up so far and is adding more as we

go to press. Don't forget the hobby shops while you are on the tour!

The July 10th Mini-Meet will be hosted by none other than John Sigurdson, MMR. John has done more for our Division and Region than most and has helped many of us with his years of experience in the hobby. John's "Dakota & North Western" is an "experience" you don't want to miss. He has one of the best operating N scale railroads anywhere. In the same room he is also building an O-Scale railroad with On3 and On30 branchlines. If the weather is good he may have his outdoor O-Scale railroad running. His shop is worth the trip and you can spend hours picking up tricks of the


trade about building things - it quickly becomes obvious why he is a Master Model Railroader. I






