THEFT!

Model Trains Stolen from Walter Anderson Nursery

Between the hours of 5:40 P.M. on March 2nd, 2007 and 8:15 A.M. on March 3rd, 2007, suspect(s) unknown entered the grounds of Walter Andersen Nursery in Poway, California and either destroyed or stole several thousand dollars worth of track, large scale rolling stock and plants. The crimes are being investigated by the Poway office of the San Diego County Sheriff's Department.

The suspect(s) entered the grounds by cutting the chain link fence at the southwestern corner of the property and then proceeded to the garden railroad layout area where they vandalized several feet of track, buildings, and bridges. Apparently, the suspect(s) were interrupted at some point because they left a trash barrel filled with buildings and track and switches stacked at both the point of exit and at various locations on the layout. However, losses to both the thefts and vandalism are extensive and the losses are in the thousands of dollars.

Please pay attention to anyone who is trying to sell used track or rolling stock. The track and switches are either LGB or Aristocraft code 332 brass. The stolen rolling stock consists of some dozen boxcars, Aristocraft Santa Fe dome liner streamline passenger cars, and three Aristocraft track cleaning cabooses (one yellow, one gray, one red). Also, three(3) Aristocraft log cars are missing.

Unique items lost are as follows: one(1) boxcar specially lettered for Walter Andersen Nursery,





AMERICAN FLYER TOY TRAIN EXHIBIT OPENS MAY 19, 2007 AT THE SAN DIEGO MODEL RAILROAD MUSEUM IN BALBOA PARK

For over a century American Flyer toy trains have been fascinating all ages of train enthusiasts. The San Diego American Flyer Association, a division of the All Gauge Toy Train Association, will be utilizing the Museum's Pacific Beach Club room to display numerous varieties of classic toy trains. The exhibit will feature original American Flyer trains from the late 1940's and 50's, an era where the trains became even more realistic with engine smoke and sound. The exhibition opens May 19 and will be on view through June 3 at the San Diego Model Railroad Museum.

American Flyer trains have had a significant presence in the toy train business since the beginning of the 1900's. These toy trains were originally run on a larger O gauge track, but in 1946 A.C. Gilbert introduced a two rail track system as well as steam engines with smoke and sound in order to make the trains appear more realistic.

Today, the Lionel Model Train Company manufactures the American Flyer trains. Throughout the years Lionel has improved the classic model by creating a new line of locomotives as well as using state of the art rail sounds. However, while they have generated more updated trains, Lionel also reproduces many of the A.C. Gilbert era popular locomotives, cars, and accessories.

The expansive layout will feature both classic O gauge locomotives and cars as well as more current models.

The San Diego Model Railroad Museum is open Tuesday-Friday 11:00 AM - 4:00 PM and 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday. Children under 15 years old are free, adult admission is \$6. ***

The San Diego Society of N Scale (SDSONS) has been busy improving their layout, the "PACIFIC DESERT LINES" (PDL). It may not appear so to the casual observer as most of the recent



work has involved installing control systems under the bench work.. Not only is there a fully operational normal DC Control system but there is also fully operational computer control system (The Chubb System). This system, as installed, is capable of dealing with up to 6 trains running in either direction at the same time and allows for unattended operations if required. The most recent enhancement was the installation of the NCE DCC system. The entire layout, mains, branches, yards and sidings are operational with the DCC system. At present we are working on obtaining the software to allow us to combine the computer and DCC systems and are expected to be operational within the next month or so. Further down the line will be installation of the hardware that will allow control of the turnouts with the DCC system. Eventually a signal system will be installed and tied into the DCC/ computer system. A more obvious improvement to the PDL is the addition of scenery to the "National City Yard;" particularly the areas around the


