certificates but may not know it. Some have resisted the program because of the documentation requirements. This is the first area that I am prepared to offer assistance. If you'd like to discuss the program, review my paperwork or have a copy, please let me know. Just like modeling, if there is a prototype to examine, we can use it to create/ develop our own work product. I should also add that our AP Chair, Ed Hatch and local MMR's like Rodger Gredvig, John Sigurdson, and Paul Schmitt have been very supportive in this quest.

On a different subject, I can't believe that we're already gearing up for the holiday season but that time is upon us again. Over the years we've all been the victim of a well intended gift giver who presents us with a railroad item that we have no interest in or use for. For non-modelers, it's tough to select the right road name, era, or scale. It can be pretty complicated for them when you think about it. None of us want to appear ungrateful but if it can't be exchanged or re-gifted, it winds up at the next swap meet. You may also be placed in the awkward position of explaining what happened to it or why you're not using it.

So how do we prevent this from happening? Take the opportunity to create a wish list with a variety of items and a broad price range. Our loved ones are usually thrilled to have the guess work taken out of finding a perfect gift and a varied price range makes it possible for everyone to participate. Be sure to include brand, stock numbers and specify your scale and preferred road name. You could help further by identifying the easiest and least expensive location/method to locate and purchase the item by providing a catalog, store name or web site. Make your list available to those you exchange gifts with or post it in a prominent place like on the refrigerator.

Having trouble thinking of items you want or need? How about magazine subscriptions or club membership fees? Are there any new books out there that you want? If you're building a new layout you're going to need basic staples like track, switches and roadbed. Scenery items are always appreciated and quite varied (backdrops, vegetation, structures, vehicles, people, detail parts, etc). What about rolling stock or locomotives? Are you thinking about transitioning from DC to DCC? If nothing comes to mind, there are always gift certificates to your favorite hobby or hardware

Achievement Award Tips

One of the most heard complaints following contest judging is "why did I get such a low score"? Low scores often discourage modelers so much that they swear they will never enter another contest or submit a model for judging ever again. I think we can all understand their frustration, most MMRs felt that way when they began. The problem is usually two-fold: (1) the modeler did not carefully read the requirements (or didn't adequately understand them) and (2) the Judges did not help the modeler to see where the model could be improved to garner more points. Please note the clearly stated purpose of the Achievement Program (found on the judging form matrix), especially the last sentence:

"The purpose of the AP is to recognize and reward good model building. The purpose of contest judging is to choose the winning models in each category. The primary purpose of these guidelines is to help the judges choose the winners. Their secondary purpose is to encourage consistency in scoring. The judges' aim should be to evaluate the models <u>both to inform the modelers of their success</u> <u>and to help them to improve their modeling skills</u>.

As judges (and any NMRA member can be a judge), the secondary task is to help the modeler identify the opportunities to improve the model and elevate the quality of the work performed. But often, the problem is not the quality of the work, but the amount of work, or lack of description of the work. A four-sided simple plastic kit is obviously not contest (or 87.5 pt) worthy. Neither is a scratch built structure worthy if the amount of parts consists of 4 walls, a roof, a few windows, and a door, no matter how well executed. Remember the advice to include quantity, quality and complexity. So if your model falls short of your expectations, do not be discouraged. Ask the judges (they signed their names at the bottom of the form) how they judged your model and what would bring it up to AP standards. It is part of their job to explain.

If you are new to contests or AP judging here is some important advice: Volunteer to be a judge at a contest before you enter a contest (beginners and experienced judges are often paired). Learn what makes or breaks a model in terms of enough points for a Merit Award. Your own models will benefit from your broadened experience.

Next time, tips on filling out paperwork.


