Saturday, October 12, 2019, 8:00am - 12:00pm North County Model Railroad Society (NCMRS), Oceanside, CA

The October Division Event will be held in conjunction with the **NCMRS Fall Swap meet and Train Show** at Heritage Park in Oceanside. Don't miss out on this free event. Parking is also free. A wide assortment of new and used model railroad items will be on sale including locomotives, rolling stock, track, structures, and accessories; as well as railroadiana and railroad-related publications.


Layout Exhibit: NCMRS's big 1950s-era HO scale layout will be in operation, including a large expansion area that is operational as work on scenery and structures continues. Clinics: Arnie's Trains of Westminster will present a special clinic covering all aspects of DCC.

Celebrity Modelers: Five exceptional modelers will be displaying examples of their craftsmanship. They include: **John Burrow**, a modeler of British prototypes will show several of his handcrafted brass locomotives built to UK 0 scale standard (1:43.5 or 7mm to the foot).

Glen Furtado, an associate of the Miniature Engineering Craftsmanship Museum will showcase several items. The collection at the Carlsbad museum is considered second only to the Smithsonian.

Steve Harris, a world-class modeler and member of the Narrow Gauge Hall of Fame, has published more than 35 articles in Narrow Gauge & Short Line Gazette and Model Railroader magazines describing the construction of his HOn3 Rio Grande Southern Railroad. Several of Steve's scratch built structures will be on display.



George Huckaby, past president of the Orange Empire Railway Museum in Perris, and nationally recognized traction expert will present an operating HO scale LRV and traction layout operating from an overhead wire at the NCMRS Train Show.

Paul Lubliner, is a professional model maker best known in the model railroad community as the creator of the Highliner EMD F unit diesel locomotives. Athearn thought so highly of the model they purchased Paul's F-unit tooling and used it to launch the firm's Genesis premium line of HO models. In addition to railroad items, Paul will show samples of models he has built for movie and TV studios.

DICK TROTTER'S COYOTE PASS AND NORTHERN


In September we toured Dick Trotter's Coyote Pass and Northern which is an extensive HO scale layout in Lakeside. He has recently rebuilt parts of the building in which the layout sits. This is one of the more significant home layouts in the San Diego Area. The era has a fairly wide span with the layout being mostly in the 50s but the motive power stretching into the 60s.

The layout is very carefully detailed and artfully done. Dick has pioneered layout techniques that never received much publicity because Dick doesn't seek that. There are some beautiful background scenes done by Glenn Shimada. Dick also makes use of Photo shopped buildings that look very realistic. The initial view of the layout is an amazing complex city scene with buildings on top of buildings put together in a convincing manner. The layout is also set up for operation sessions which Dick conducts regularly. (Pictures courtesy of Trudy Seeley).



route from Barstow to Kingman Arizona with very little space between towns. It contains a Borax mill in the town of Borate (which was once the location of a Borax mine near Calico California). It also has three different mines. The layout is NCE DCC and follows the transition era.



As the name suggests the layout is inspired by high desert railroading in California. It is a freelanced layout based in some reality. The HO gauge layout sits in a three car garage and is approximately 14 by 22 feet, single level. It is at least 60% completed with most of the structures placed on the layout. All the track is in and working, except for a planned hidden fiddle yard. It still needs fine detailing and some landscaping. It roughly follows the Santa Fe



GERMANY BY TRAIN TO MINIATUR WUNDERLAND

In June of 2018 I flew to Zurich Switzerland with my wife, Natividad and we subsequently met up with my son, Graham in Munich, Germany. 48 years ago, while in college, I studied in Germany for a half year and always remember Munich and Berlin as my favorite cities there. After spending a few days in Munich we took a train to Berlin. It is easy to ride trains in Europe. To get tickets, go to the train station as soon as you can and buy them at the ticket office. The clerks all speak English, which came in handy for me because I have forgotten most of my German.

At the ticket office, always ask for any available discounts. A ticket with a specific time is cheaper than an open ticket. You should consider getting a reserved seat because the trains can get crowded which may require you to stand. If you buy tickets in advance, you can save money but the tickets aren't that expensive and I always plan my trips on the fly. The trains are fast, so you are usually no longer than 3 or 4 hours on a train. You can buy tickets for local trains at the last minute. The larger train stations also have a tourist help office where you can get a hotel room, bus tickets and many other forms of help from English speaking clerks.

After a few days in Berlin, I convinced my family to go with me to Hamburg, Germany to visit Miniatur Wunderland, which is possibly the largest train layout in the world. Hamburg is a nice city with the possible exception of its Reeperbahn neighborhood. The Beatles lived and performed there at the beginning of their career. It has night clubs, many bars and strip joints that are notorious for over charging. It is worth a walk through at dusk.



Miniatur Wunderland is near the wharf in a refurbished warehouse and it is on four floors. Buy your tickets in advance on line and you will receive a time to show up. The Alps section of the layout takes up two open floors to accommodate the mountains.



Miniatur Wunderland is actually many separate layouts and covers various countries including the United States which is at the beginning. That section of the layout looks like it was one of their first projects. I wish they had hired some of the great modelers here in the US to design it. Nevertheless, it is an interesting rendition of our railroads. As you progress through Miniatur Wunderland, the quality of the layouts improve. It will take three to four hours to see it all. The vastness and detail of the layouts is amazing. There is an airport that is full of activity and which uses the latest animation techniques. There are videos of most of Miniatur Wunderland on YouTube. Near the end of is one of their more recent and best works, which covers scenes from Rome and outlying areas. For a model railroader, Miniatur Wunderland is one of the wonders of the world and I highly recommend visiting it if you can. Of course, traveling through Europe by train, is another wonder of the world for any rail fan. If you are going to fly all the way to Europe, you should do some rail travel as well.

For information about travel destinations in Europe look at Tripadvisor online. Tripadvisor is also handy for purchasing local tours at a discount. You can download the Tripadvisor app on your phone. There are also helpful apps for rail travel in Europe. One that I use is Rail Planner. Most of Rick Steves' travel videos are available for free on YouTube.
