

My Home Library

Research at hand, 24/7

Several years ago I happened across a listing on Craigslist for model railroad magazines. After a little negotiation, I managed to secure hundreds of issues of Model Railroader & Railroad Model Craftsman ranging in age from 1960 to 2006. I already had several issues of both from my youth, ranging from 1997 to 2001, this allowed me to compile an even greater collection.

Since then, I've purchased collections, and single issues, from swap meets, eBay auctions, the San Diego Model Railroad Museum's library, and various people I've met through Craigslist postings. In the past 4 years, I've nearly completed my collection from 1960 onward of both *Model Railroader* and *Railroad Model Craftsman*.

Now comes the fun of completing collections of the NMRA's various publications, historical and modeling societies, and other major modeling magazines. I have various issues from *Model Railroading*, *RailModel Journal*, *Prototype Modeler*, *The Warbonnet*, ect.

My collection also contains numerous books. Of these I like to note the book titled "*The American Railroad Freightcar*", which I was fortunate enough to win in the Chinese auction at the PSR convention held in San Diego in September of 2010.

Owning this resource betters my authoring of articles for my own website, and for Joe Fugate's e-magazine, *Model Railroad Hobbyist*¹, in addition to other various articles planned for NMRA publications or other print magazines. My library also provides for 24/7 research, should the need arise, for my own modeling endeavors. As I build my research library, I welcome anyone who needs information to contact me and we can set-up a

"research session" in my apartment in the Mira Mesa community of San Diego. A semi-current digital library catalog is online, hosted on my server, here: http://library.modelrailroadtips.com/opac/index.php

The website has little in the way of search tips, however, there are numerous ways to check out the catalog. The easiest, though most labor intensive, would be to leave the search block blank, and click the search button. This brings up the entire contents of the catalog.

The other option would be to search keywords. Say you're looking for anything on the Santa Fe, simply type "Santa Fe" and click search. All key wording is accomplished by me, and both ATSF & Santa Fe should work.

Now, I must say, cataloging the entire collection is time consuming. To catalog a single issue of a magazine, I keyword the article titles, and enter all the authors. This can take nearly an hour per issue. I'm working on it day by day, but I hope to get some more done before this article is published.

Please, feel free to write me an email if you're looking for a certain article, or book, or info on some prototype. I'll do my best to help you find it, and if I have it you're more then welcome to come visit. There's a phone number at the top of the library page, or you can email me at josh@blockchoice.com.

California On30 Modular Group, the Narrow Minded Group

The California South Coast Modular group is one of four relatively new On30 group operating in California. On30 means the models are O scale (1:48 running on 32mm gauge track). The 'n' signifies Narrow gauge and the 30 means 30 inches, or 2.5 feet. This means the full size train runs on 2 foot, 6 inch gauge track. A famous example of this is Puffing Billy in Victoria, which is a 2.5 foot gauge railway. It just so happens that 16.5mm

gauge (HO) track is an almost exact match for 30 inches in 1:48 scale. So what we have is O scale trains running on HO track and for it to look correct, we use Peco On30 track with O scale ties.

For anyone looking to hook up with an On30 group, California has four groups covering most of California. All four groups share the same interface standard that is also being used by a number of groups in other states. The California Central Coast group was the first and they got their start in March 2005. They are based in the San Jose/Bay area. Next to get going was the Central Valley Modular group in the Fresno/Hanford area. The third group to get going was the California South Coast On30 Modular group. This group covers the Grapevine area south into Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego areas. Last but not least is the California Northern & Cascade Modular RR Group in the Redding area of northern California.

The California Modular groups were setup as free form modules, but with connectivity the key to the standard. This includes physical and electrical with operations as the key. The time period we model is set from the late 1800's to the 1930's. Never done and always changing, the On30 Model Railroad groups' mission is to bring the joy of narrow gauge trains to kids of all ages at train shows in California.

All groups use train shows and Fun runs to meet up and run trains. At this time only the California Central Coast group has monthly meetings. All groups are open and welcome anyone; there are no fees or dues. We all share a hook up standard each module must use, but we have no rules other then having fun. We are looking for a few good men,and women, and young people..... and in no set order!

Because of our hook up standard we share with other groups, we are able to meet up at shows with the other groups. Our first multi group hook up was at the Worlds greatest hobby show in February 2010, in Long Beach. This year we plan to have 4 plus groups hook up for the first time in Sacramento California at the National Train Show. Most of groups display at GTE shows, The Big Train Show and National-type show in California.

LAYOUT TOURS

March Layout Tour



In March we were fortunate to be able to visit Roy "Pat" Archer (L, with Tom Northrop. This is the top floor section, under construction in background and at right.)! Pat has one of the most incredible collections of Lionel Trains in the U.S. He houses this collection in a 6000 sq. ft. three story "room addition" to his home in Escondido. Track runs between floors, through helices, and along shelves on walls connecting the four layouts. He has both diesel and steam locomotives, some dating back to the 1930's, with freight and passenger trains of every description. If Lionel made it, Pat has it on

one of his four layouts. The walls of his home, and shelves under the layout, display locomotives and rolling stock in addition to the myriad of equipment operating on the layout. Some features of the layout include and operating carnival, a three-ring circus, and an operating hot air balloon. This home layout is larger than many museum


layouts! **April Layout Tour**

Ron Couisineau's G scale garden railway is centered in his back yard on a 20'x40' raised bed. It

has a western theme, complete with a mine, a lumber mill, an old west town, and an Indian village. In addition, Ron has a separate layout at the side of his house to run his 2-6-6-2T, which is too big for the turns on his main layout. The main layout has approximately 400 feet of track with a staging yard under the raised foundation of the house. What is interesting about this layout is the innovative use of everyday materials to build scenery and structures. For instance, Ron has scratch-built the gantry crane for his lumber mill yard. He



also found a bird house for about \$6, and has used several of them to create buildings on his layout. Ron also made his own stage coach, that runs in a circle around his western town. Ron has demonstrated that you don't need a fat wallet to build a very presentable and interesting





June 11th Layout Tour

Dick Trotter - Coyote Pass & Northern (HO)

The Coyote Pass & Northern, housed in its own space that has expanded over time, is the result of many years of work by Dick and his crew. Built for operation, with a number of highly detailed "destinations" that can keep train crews occupied for hours with interesting switching problems, the CP&N is one railroad you won't want to miss. Of special note is the complete repainting of the backdrops by Glenn Shimada. The combination of fine modeling, outstanding detail, and well-designed operation track plan, managed by Rail Ops, is a free-lanced railroad you'll enjoy visiting.

July 16th Layout Tour

Duncan McRee - Tam Valley Railroad (HO)

Note that the date of this tour has been delayed a week to avoid conflict with the NMRA National convention in Sacramento. The Tam Valley RR is a proto-freelanced model railroad based on the Southern Pacific. It is a shelf-style layout running through three bedrooms as a point-to-point layout about 80 feet long. The Tam Valley RR starts as harbor scene in Sausalito, California, runs up the Sierra Mountains, along the Truckee River, through the Nevada desert, and terminates at Ogden, Utah. The layout features beautiful scenery including hand-painted backdrops, numerous streams and rivers, and a number of Bob Mitchell's "Perfect Pines." There are also a large number of craftsman structure kits on the layout. A new multilevel Donner Summit layout is under construction that features the interchange between the Southern Pacific and the HOn3 Nevada County Narrow Gauge Railroad.

September 10th Layout Tour

David Balser - Onion Valley Railroad (On30)

The Onion Valley Railroad is a reincarnation of David's former HO scale railroad that appeared in Model Railroader. The railroad has been in transition to the new scale since the article appeared, and is now ready to be displayed for our enjoyment. Featuring several engines constructed or super-detailed by Bob Schimmel, MMR, this railroad is all about operation. There are also some scenic gems, like the sky and clouds painted on the reverse of the valance that you can see from the opposite side of the aisle. David's "Jazz and Pie" operating group includes some of the best modelers in the area. I'm anxious to see this railroad, becaue if it's is anything like the HO scale version, it will be a gem!

October 8th Layout Tour

Poway Station Modular (HO)

In October we will visit Poway Station, in Templar's Hall, Old Poway Park, Poway. A portion of their HO layout will be on display as part of Old Poway Park's annual Train Song Festival. Poway Station has been working on upgrading their modules from a simple loop for running trains, to an operational layout, combining standard modules with Free-Mo modules in the process. The Free-Mo modules have been lowered to match the standard height of the main layout, but otherwise conform to the Free-Mo standard.

As well as the layout, there will be two stages of entertainment, train vendors (for the kids), crafts, and food. The Poway Midland Railroad will be offering rides behind their 1907 Baldwin steam locomotive.

The layout will be open from 10am until 7pm, with the NMRA Division portion taking place from noon to 3, as usual. At 7pm Old Poway Park will be showing a train movie under the stars. A great time for the family, and it's all free (except the food and train rides!).

Pacific Southwest Region Annual Convention

The 2011 PSR Convention is being hosted by the Arizona Division of the Pacific Southwest Region, NMRA (http://www.azdiv-nmra.org/). The Convention begins on Wednesday, September 21st, and ends Sunday, September 25th, 2011. Events include clinics, layout tours, prototype tours, Train rides, auction and banquet. September is one of the best months to visit Flagstaff with weather typically clear and perfectly warm-but-not-hot. Average highs are in the mid 70s and evening lows in the 40s and 50s.

There will be clinics, operating sessions (home and club layouts), and prototype tours. Additionally there will be layout tours (2 modeled in 1.5" scale!), the PSR Contest Room, Railette events, and many other activities to keep you interested, informed and entertained. 


