On a different note, we're going to be trying a different approach to getting information out to you. The postcards that get sent out each month have been a great success (according to those I've talked to at the events), so those will be continued. However, it is expensive to send out both the cards and a 10 page newsletter - printing and postage being the main culprits. Additionally, while it is not obvious in the printed issue, the photographs in the "Mail Hook" are in color, but color printing is very expensive so we don't do it. While the Division is not by any means "broke", the funds we have are finite, and will be almost exhausted by printing and mailing costs before our next "influx" of funds, the PSR Convention in 2006 - which will also need funding. So, there will be a few changes:

First, the Mail Hook will no longer sent out in paper form to all members. Instead, it will be published electronically (e-mail and the website) - this will enable you to get it faster, with color and more pages. If you don't have access to e-mail or the web (and not everyone does), you can get a paper copy in one of 2 ways - attend a Division function (Meet, layout tour, etc), where they will be available, or assist with the cost of the publication with a small subscription fee of \$6.00/year for NMRA members. In order to receive each quarterly issue by e-mail, send your e-mail address to: sddiv@sbcglobal.net. Please include your full name, address and phone number as well, so that we can update our records. Your e-mail information will not be released to anyone outside of the NMRA for any purpose.

Secondly, we will be expanding informational mailings such as post cards and flyers to keep you informed of upcoming and current events. These appear to be a much better use of our funds, and will keep you informed of "what's happening" as it happens.

Thirdly, as I've mentioned in the past, we're working on getting the Division Website up and running - we have a domain name, and are mainly waiting on the Webmaster (that's me) to get the Continued on page 7

#### Layout Meets & Tours

The year is coming to an end, and we have seen some <u>great</u> layouts! I would like to thank the gentlemen who have invited us to their homes during the past year and shared the Model Railroads they have built. January – Don Fowler, February – Art & Lou Dominy, March – Nelson Rath, April – Bob Chapparo Orange County Road Trip, May – Rodger Gredvig and Randy Schissler, June – Cajon Division Tour, July – John Sigurdson, August – San Diego Model Railroad Museum, September – Dick Roberts, and in October – Dave Balser.

Coming up in November and December



are two really neat layouts: Ross Black's On30 "Beaver Creek Railway" and in December the "World Famous" Steve Harris and his

HOn3 "Rio Grande Southern".

Ross has been working in On30 for about 15 years and has a mining railroad with very large trees and scratch built buildings. Ross always has at least a half dozen projects on his workbench and a few dozen more in the works. I have known Ross for a long time and he is one of the most creative modelers around. His layout is in his garage and the atmosphere he has created is pure fun. Watch out for the real whipsaws hanging from his ceiling! Even if you are not working in this scale you will see some new ideas and have a good time.

I refer to Steve as "World Famous" because his efforts have been rewarded by a cover shot and an article in the November '04 issue of Model Railroader. Check that issue for all the details. Steve is an excellent modeler and has been a clinician at many conventions. His railroad is a two level design, is operated by DCC and the locomotive sounds, especially the Goose, make everything come to life.

The Layout Tours for the first three months of 2005 are set. We will be making a return visit to

the N-scale Southern Pacific of Don Fowler, the HOn30 Westside Lumber Company of Burton Maxwell, and the HO scale B&O "West End" of Jack Byers.

Since our last visit to Don's layout last January a lot of work has been done. Don models the Southern Pacific during the 1975 to 1995 period between West Colina and Colfax, California, with guest appearances by other west coast railroads. Features include sound systems, operating grade crossings, block signals, and night lighting. Since the last visit Don and his crew have completed a lot more scenery, the desert town of Mojave, three tunnels, a stream, a motel, and a campground. There is also new night lighting and more sound effects. As we go to press Don has assured me many new projects will be completed by January.

A new layout on the tour will be the Westside Lumber Company of Burton Maxwell. Burton is recreating portions of the famous logging line in HOn3 and is incorporating certain aspects of the real company such as Buffalo Landing, Camp 8, River Bridge, Cleavey River Bridge and eventually Camp 45. Current projects under way are the engine facilities, car repair shops, sand & oil facility and the sawmill. The layout is a point to point design in a 16x37 foot room with scenery about halfway done and trackage about 80% complete. Being scheduled for a layout tour normally motivates a builder, and Burton is planning on completing a lot of those projects he has underway.

Jack Byers has purchased a 12x42 foot modular building, has set it up next to his house and dedicated it 100% to his railroad. A space of 8x12 feet has been set aside at one end for his workshop,

library, and lounge area. Jack is modeling the B&O "West End" with

the hub

of the railroad set in Grafton, West Virginia in the mid 1950's. Big steam is predominant, but diesels are arriving. The terrain is steep but the grades are limited to 2%. The creeks and hollers will have mines and lumber operations that provide the operating revenue. The layout is a two level walk in design with benchwork around three walls and a center peninsula. By March track will be laid and the train will be running. Jack thanked me for getat (760) 436-6139 and I will get you directions. Layout tours are set up for members and associates, but you are encouraged to bring along anyone who is interested in the hobby.

#### Director's Report By Rodger Gredvig, MMR

At the recent PSR convention in Glendale the election results were announced and Ed Hall won a second term as PSR President. Since there were no candidates for VP, Bill Mergard of the LA Division has accepted the appointment by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors. With the adoption of the LRP (Long Range Plan) at the National Convention last June, the regional President will now also serve on the NMRA Regional Advisory Council as our representative. Therefore, the position of Trustee will no longer exit after June 30, 2005. In the

meantime, Bill Jacobs of the Cajon Division was elected to serve the remaining months as Trustee. We will learn more about the new structure after the National Trustee Board meets in January.

At the PSR Board of Directors a decision was made to revise the contract policy for hosting the regional conventions.

Beginning in 2006 (San Diego's turn), the host Division will receive "the first 30% of net profits, with the remaining sum split between the host and the region" -- essentially this means a 65-35% distribution. In the past the San Diego Division kept the first \$4000, before splitting the remainder with the region. Curiously, under the old policy, over the last 10 years the San Diego Division contributed more than \$9000 to the Region -which (discounting the National Convention in Long Beach) was more than the other 3 divisions combined! The new policy is believed by some as a way to bring additional revenue to the region which is suffering from stagnated growth in membership. Time will tell. In the meantime, we have already begun a search for a site for our next PSR Convention in 2006. If you have suggestions (or special connections) please let us know.

Speaking of the Board of Directors, I will complete my maximum two terms as Director next year. A new Director (or slate of candidates) needs to be proposed by the mid-year BoD in March. Please submit names (even your own) to our Superintendent, Ben Sevier prior to that date.



President's Award in the First PSR Entry category, and First Place in the Color Photography category


for his picture "4449 Meets the Yakima". Bob also presented an interesting clinic at the convention. Congratulations, Bob!


