The Spring Meet was held May 8 at Peace Lutheran Church. Thanks to Rodger Gredvig, MMR, for making the facility available to us. There was the usual pot luck, and a short business meeting. speed matching table (left - all photos this article Pete Steinmetz). Jim Campbell gave an impromptu electronics clinic as well. In case you missed Dick's and Eric's clinics, they will be repeated at the Pacific Souhtwest Region Annual Convention, coming up in September, right here in San Diego.

Because everyone is involved in preparations for the convention, we will not hold our traditional Summer Meet in August. Instead, Ben Sevier will open his HO layout on the 14th, and we'll have a layout tour and picnic at his place. This will be the first time Ben has shown his layout, having only recently completed the main line. He's made a lot of progress in the past year or so, by hosting a work group the fourth

Saturday of every month. There's still work to be done, but trains are running! He's got some cool things going on, you shouldn't miss this opportunity. He also invites you to bring your bathing suit, if you're so inclined. Watch for more information.

As the convention approaches, the committee is hard at work putting the finishing touches in place. We'll also need the help of some volunteers to be successful. Volunteers will work about four hours on the day they volunteer, but they should be registered for the convention. We need everything from help at the Registration Desk and Company Store, to help with directions, and everything in between. You'll have plenty of time to enjoy the clinics, layout and prototype tours, and other events.

If you haven't registered, there's still time to get a reduced rate. Full registration is still only \$70 until August 1st, when it goes up to \$80. If you can only attend one or two days, the single day registration is only \$30 per day. For that small fee, you get 16 clinics each day, by locally and nationally known clinicians. You get the opportunity to sign up for prototype tours to the Pacific Southwest Railway Museum; the San Diego Trolley Museum; PASHA, the auto trans-loading facility in the South Bay; or San Juan Capistrano via Amtrak. You get the Company Store, where you can purchase convention-related items, You get the banquet, with guest speaker Tony Koester . You get to tour some of the best layouts in Southern California. Your significant other can register for the Non-Rail progam. Seriously, you need to register! This is going to be one great time! Registration is available using the form included, or on the web page. If you register on line, you can pay with a credit card via PayPal. There's no reason NOT to do this. Here's the web site:

Convention & Swap Meet hosted by the San Diego Division, PSR, NMRA - www.sandiegodivision.org

This year's annual Pacific Southwest Regional convention will be held right here in San Diego. It will feature many instructional clinics on a wide variety of topics, including this year's emphasis on railroad operations, model and prototype. Clinics will run all day Thursday and Friday, and Saturday morning. At press time clinicians include nationally known names such as (in the order scheduled) Scott Mason, Dick Roberts, Steve Harris, Tony Koester, Duncan McRee, Burton Maxwell, Don Mitchell, and Bill Kaufman. Local luminaries include Bill Jacobs, Ed Hall, John Sigurdson, Gary Robinson, Chuck Nauman, Ben Sevier, Bob Chaparro, Bob Mitchell, Gordon Miller, and Carl Heimberger, among others. Two notes to keep in mind: 1) there is an extra materials charge for the "Backdrop Painting" clinic, and it's limited to 24 students; and 2) Burton Maxwell's "Buildings from Wood" clinic is limited to 24 students. Pre-registration is required for these clinics, so be sure to contact the Registrar to enroll in either. There's a complete clinic list on the web page, <u>http://www.psrconvention.org/2010/index.html</u> and click on the Events tab.

While you're on the web page, be sure to check out the Extra Fare items. You'll find the Extra Fare items are shown, including the Company Store items and the prototype tours. Tours are generally limited by the capacity of the bus, so you'll want to sign up for these soon. Note that this year, convention shirts are available in both men's and women's styles. Contact the Registrar for Extra Fare items as well.

If you know someone who hasn't registered (including you!), be sure to tell them to get on it! Fees go up August 1, so save some bucks and register now. While you're looking at the clinics and Extra Fare items, you can register and pay on-line, using your credit card, with PayPal. You should send in the form as well, but registering on-line will hold your place.

You should also think about making yoiur hotel reservations, if you haven't already. The current rate, \$105 per night plus tax, is good only until August 26. After that it isn't guaranteed. There are still rooms available at the group rate, but don't wait and be left out in the cold, or in the "No-tell Motel." We encourage you to stay in the convention hotel, since you get a break on parking that way, and it helps us meet our room guarantee, which translates into more resouces available for us to show you a good time. Make your reservations directly with the hotel, on-line at <u>https://www.reservations-page.com/C00180/H00189/</u> <u>be.ashx?pc=nmra</u> or call (619) 298-0511 and use the group code NMRA-Pacific Southwest Region or National Model Railroad Association.

Don't forget to bring something for the Swap meet, or one of the auctions. The swap meet will allow you to haggle directly with the buyer and get a price you agree to, and the auction will result in the best price you can get, less our commission of course. It's your choice which way you want to go, but if you don't bring anything, you can't go either way.

For those of you who have never been to a Railroad Prototype Modeler's (RPM) meet, you're in for a real treat! These guys do some of the best modeling you'll ever see, and you get to talk with them about how they do it. Who knows, you might find a kindred spirit who's been

lurking just off your radar. Admission to the RPM meet is included in your convention registration. If you just want to attend the RPM meet, you can do that, for a separate admission charge. There is a discount from the "RPM only" admission if you bring a model to display. But then you'll miss out on all the other great things going on. You can register for the convention for a single day, and get the best of both. Information is on the web page.

Finally, if you're interested in attending an operating session, please contact Dick Roberts via e-mail at rlroberts44@cox.net. We have a number of operating sessions lined up on some great layouts, at different days and times. But many hosts have limited space to accommodate visiting crew, and reservations are on a first come, first served basis. We also need to know if you'll have transportation, or if you'll need it. You must be registered for the convention before you can register for your choice of operating session (you can register at the same time, if you'd like).



What are you waiting for? You won't find a better model railroad event in Southern California this year! Get on the web page, complete the registration form, and send it in. Time's a-wastin'!

NMRA NEWS

The 75th Annual NMRA National Convention has just wrapped up in Milwaukee, and some big news was announced. The most visible to all of us will be the new logo, shown at right. This logo replaces the old driver and coupler logo, and is one step in an effort to improve the NMRA brand recognition by the public. It represents a portion of a truck, showing the wheel, and the "nmra.org" represents the truck sideframe. This is intended to represent a more modern, forward-thinking orgainzation.

The new logo will tie in with a name change in Scale Rails, to "NMRA Magazine" that you will soon see, and several other efforts currently underway. More information is, or will be, available on the NMRA web page, www.NMRA.org. (*As far as I know, you may continue to use your return address labels with the old logo.* 8^D Ed.)



The second big change is that current Vice President Allen Pollock will resign, and the Vice Presidency will be split into two positions. This will require a change to the Regulations, but that is in progress. One VP postion will handle budgets, finances, and headquarters operations. This position, Vice President of Administration, will be held by Dave Thornton. The second VP position will handle coordination with Regions, Divisions, and Special Interest Groups (SIGs). Almost all of Max's buildings are scratch built, to represent buildings he remembers from his early days on the Jersey shore. Business names similarly reflect businesses

that existed in the area. There is an emphasis on steam power, both Pennsy and Reading (the Seashore Lines was a joint venture). The layout supports three operators, and Max holds operating sessions every Friday night. Below, Pennsy power waits to move some varnish. (Gary Robinson photo)

On May 1, 2010, members of the San Diego S Gaugers (SDSG) participated in the S Fest West, hosted by the Southern California S Gaugers Club (SCSGC) in Arcadia, California. Four modules from the Powell Yard were selected to represent SDSG's layout and temporary wings were constructed and clamped on the ends to



on the ends to gain about 24-inches of "mainline" track beyond the switch points.



Club members Peter Gagnon, Bob Graves, Mike Forys and Al Keil set up the modules and demonstrated the improved control of multiple trains moving into and out of the yard which is designed to accommodate all three of the common wheel profiles and gauging found in S scale, high rail, and original Gilbert American Flyer. The yard is seven tracks wide, counting the two mains, and has a passing siding and one-or-more stub tracks connected to each main. All of the turnouts are motorized and are centrally controlled from the DCC system. A DCC throttle on the AC control panel provides turnout control to the AC side operators. For this one special event, we isolated the innermost track and powered it with TMCC, thereby demonstrating all three power systems at

A wireless DCC throttle was available for visitors who wanted to try their hand at operating the DCC equipment and to practice switching the outer main portion of the yard. Using the AC controls on the back side, the same options were available on the inner main for visitors who were more traditionally inclined.
